Pentecost is the fiftieth and final day of the Easter season. The Paschal Candle shall be extinguished after having burned throughout the fifty days. It shall be returned to the baptismal font and will burn only at baptisms and funerals until next Easter. Holy Communion will be celebrated, and all are invited to wear red on Pentecost Sunday.

On Sunday, May 26th, we shall celebrate the festival of **The Holy Trinity**. This is the only festival on the church calendar that celebrates a Christian doctrine and not an event in the life of our Lord Jesus. And while it is impossible to fully understand all that there is to know about our Triune God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit), we celebrate this holy mystery and the ways in which God has and continues to reveal God's self to us. Holy Communion will be celebrated on Holy Trinity Sunday.

Also, starting in May, some Holy Trinity families will be celebrating graduations and upcoming retirements! We rejoice with you and pray that this milestone time of endings, new beginnings and change will bring much joy and hope and dreams for a future filled with God's richest blessings. Congratulations to all!

And last but certainly not least, many thanks to the Holy Trinity Call Committee members who continue to call upon the power, wisdom and guidance of the Holy Spirit, as they discern God's will for the future pastoral ministry here at Holy Trinity. This can be a lengthy and challenging task requiring many meetings, long and difficult discussions, patience, and unceasing prayer. UPDATE from the Vestry President

We Are Busier Than You Think

This article is to make everyone aware of how busy the worker bees at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church are in reaching out to the community. They not only worship on Sundays but during the week in their work for the church. I have placed the event dates in **bold print**. While the newsletter arrives in households on different dates due to mail delivery, and some events may have passed, I do not want you to miss knowing about all the available opportunities.

- 1) Currently the Call Process has nothing additional to report.
- 2) The Annual Report to the Congregation will be presented by Vestry Members during the forum time on **April 28 in the Fondersmith Auditorium**. The Annual Report is a time to notify the congregation of what is going on in the church. It is a time to ask questions you may have.
- Vestry elections are here again. Thank you to all those who provided names to Vestry for the election. Please vote in the upcoming election. Leadership in churches is crucial for effectively guiding the community through changes. The goal of leaders is to help explain what, why, and how while going through transitions. Voting is one way you can get involved.

4) Eric R. Riley was our guest organist for **April 7, 14, and 21.** I heard many good responses and loved seeing all who stayed for the postlude to hear him play.



- 5) Speaking of organist, we are excited for you to meet our new Organ/Choirmaster, Christopher Prestia, who will be filling the part-time organist/choirmaster position. He will be playing the organ on the first Sunday in May. There will be a meet and greet **at the end of April** for all interested voices who would like to be involved in the choir. The **May 12 Forum** is scheduled for the congregation to meet Chris. We feel, through the help of Rob Horton, we have found another talented musician to grace our church and guide us in raising our voices to the Lord. Please check upcoming announcements so you can attend the meet and greets.
- 6) We would like to introduce another newcomer to our staff. It has been difficult for our nine Homebound Visitors and the Pastors to have consistent contact with our 50 + Homebound Disciples. It was determined that the best solution would be to look for a part-time Homebound Visitation Minister. Through the Lower Susquehanna Synod, Holy Trinity has a year contract with Pastor Janyce Jorgensen. Pastor Janyce Jorgensen very recently retired from her church in York. By the time you receive this newsletter, she will have started directing our Homebound Visitors and visited some of our Homebound Disciples. She will also cover pastoral care needs that may arise. The Pastors Hanus have known Pastor Jorgensen for many years and feel she will be a great addition to Holy Trinity. I hope you will come to the meet and greet when it is scheduled. Until then Pastor Janyce will stop by to be introduced to the congregation on **April 28**th. You will learn more about Pastor Janyce in the future.
- 7) We were lucky to have as a guest speaker, Rabbi Jack Paskoff, to educate us about the Seder on **Wednesday, April 24**th **at 6:00 p.m.** The Seder is a spiritual, festive holiday meal served in Jewish homes commemorating the Exodus, the historical deliverance of the Jewish people from Egyptian bondage in the days of Moses. Seder means "order." It is called this because the meal is done in a certain order which takes you from slavery to freedom. Hope all who attended this event were enlightened about this holiday festive meal.



8) Career Connections is a first-time social networking event happening on **May 15**th **at 6:00 p.m**. The intent is to reach young professionals (primarily ages 25-40), introduce them to Holy Trinity, and ultimately, the possibility of forming another small group that could meet several times per year and maybe transition to be part of our worship community. The evening will begin with a social time in the café followed by a guest speaker, Deborah Brandt from FIG Industries, and a tour of Trinity. Good luck on this adventure!

- at 6:30 in the church. Each year the MLK Scholarship Fund provides scholarships to graduating J.P. McCaskey seniors who have been accepted to an accredited higher education program and have shown financial need. The scholarships are awarded to those who reflect Dr. King's ideals of commitment to school, community, family, and faith. All funds are raised by the Board of Directors. This year there are 38 participants to be interviewed and \$200,000 of available scholarships. This year, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church will donate \$2,500 which will be matched by MLK, Jr. Memorial Scholarship Fund to present a \$5,000 scholarship in Geoff Herr's honor. Geoff loved everything about this event and MLK staff cared greatly for Geoff. We thank them for showing how much they appreciated his help each year to make their night so special for many young people. This is for you, Geoff!!
- 10) The African American Historical Society of South-Central PA. annual tea is scheduled to occur in **Fondersmith Auditorium on Saturday, April 27, 2024, from 11:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m**. It is an annual fundraiser. Dr. Sheryl Jones-Henderson and Dr. Camille Upchurch are the speakers. Dr. Michael Jamanis from Music for Everyone will play live jazz music along with catered refreshments, and special gifts. Proceeds support the African American Archives Auxiliary of the Western Reserve Historical Society.
- 11) Quest for Learning spring sessions are scheduled from April 4 through May 9.
- 12) We have a catering service that is renting our kitchen on Wednesdays starting in April. All the hoops that needed to be jumped through for licenses and permits from the county/city have finally ended. Good luck to Delphine Butcher!

THE MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Martin Luther King, Jr Scholarship Fund was established in 1982 when a group of teachers from Lancaster's Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary School along with civic leaders of the Southeast Community, and Holy Trinity pastors began the program and decided to contribute toward a scholarship for a graduating senior at McCaskey. The student needed to be planning to go on for post-secondary education and had attended King



Elementary. Today, any graduate of the McCaskey Campus is eligible to apply. Applicants must demonstrate academic excellence, service to school and community, financial need, and the values of Martin Luther King, Jr. Generally the scholarship is used the first year of their education. However, some scholarships total \$25,000 and they can be used throughout their education. In 1982, one scholarship for \$500 was awarded. In 2023, 38 scholarships were awarded totaling \$254,500. A \$5,000 scholarship is presented each year from Trinity. This year there will also be an additional \$5,000 Trinity and Board scholarship presented in memory of our sexton, Geoff Herr who passed away in May 2023. Over \$1,000,000 has been given away since 1982. *(cont.)*

The awards ceremony will be held in our sanctuary on **Friday, May 17 at 6:30 p.m.** All are invited to attend. Thanks to our volunteers, it will also be available on Facebook and YouTube. A small reception will be held after the ceremony in the Fondersmith Auditorium.

The board of the MLK, Jr. Scholarship wants to thank Trinity for all of the assistance given over the years, especially from Geoff, and those members of Trinity who contribute every year.
